

What To Bring To A Commercial Audition

Your outfit becomes more important when going on commercial auditions as you are selling your "look" to a product.

In movies and TV, you are auditioning for a character role, but in commercials you are auditioning to be a salesperson. So pay attention to the outfit you bring.
